

## More Tennant Creek gold for Emmerson

**JUNIOR gold hopeful Emmerson Resources has reported more shallow gold mineralisation at the Golden Kangaroo East prospect, part of its Tennant Creek project area in the Northern Territory.**

Assay results were received for 18 of the 32 RC holes drilled in May, with eight of the holes containing gold mineralisation.

Better hits were 10m at 7.5 grams per tonne gold from 47m, including 2m at 35.6gpt gold and 1m at 61.3gpt gold, 7m at 5.16gpt gold from 19m, including 3m at 10gpt gold, and 9m at 3.82gpt gold from 10m, including 2m at 16.1gpt gold.

The company said drilling has confirmed the presence of potentially economic gold mineralisation within an oxidised haematite shear zone located under a few metres of cover.

Mineralisation has been intersected over a 30m strike length at a depth of 50m, though the company said there is potential for a further 20m of strike to the west with assay results for the area yet to be received.

Drilling in 2005 by the previous owner, Giants Reef Mining, returned results of 6m at 39gpt gold and 5m at 17gpt gold.

The first stage of Emmerson's 2008 drill program has been completed, but results have only been announced for Golden Kangaroo East and West Gibbet, with results for the Golden Forty and Golden Forty East prospects still to be received.

Emmerson holds around 30 tenements in the Tennant Creek goldfields, covering about 2700 square kilometres.

Shares in Emerson closed 0.05c down to 19.5c today.
